Meet the new Executive Director:



The Friends of Fidalgo Pool and Fitness Center (FPFC) would like to welcome incoming Executive Director, Mitch Everton. At the April 2017 Board of Commissioners meeting, Commissioner Jeremy McNett announced the hiring of Mitch Everton to replace outgoing Director, Marilyn Stadler. Mitch will be around the facility learning the ropes, and he will officially take on the lead role of Executive Director on July 1.

Mitch is currently a partner with John L. Scott here in Anacortes. He also works as a consultant with school districts statewide on strategic planning. Previously he ran the Anacortes Chamber of Commerce for four years and operated a successful art gallery on Commercial. Prior to moving to town in 1998, Mitch was a principal with ProBusiness Services, a publicly traded company based in CA.

Mitch is married to Linda, a frequent user of the pool and fitness classes. Together, they have three grown children, plus a rescue dog.

When asked about his motivation in taking on the role, Mitch shared that "FPFC is an essential part of the city's social fabric, a nexus for residents. The facility serves an important function in defining Anacortes and Fidalgo Island". He continued: "I look forward to working with the Commissioners and our stakeholders in helping define the next fifty years. I am excited about taking on this new challenge and in meeting those of you I don't already know."

Outgoing Executive Director, Marilyn Stadler is retiring, but she will continue her support and leadership. She recently shared her feelings on the transition: "Mitch has the knowledge and work experience to strategically plan and execute the next stage of Fidalgo Pool's growth. He understands what must be accomplished to meet the wellness needs of our community. I'm thrilled to have him join us as our new Executive Director."

You'll be seeing Mitch more and more around the facility. Please help Friends of FPFC welcome him.

Did you know... FPFC closes the pool during electrical storms? While regulations regarding the closure of indoor pools are changing, FPFC chooses safety first. To be safe during lightning storms a facility needs to be completely bonded and grounded electrically and have a lightning protection system in place. In our aging facility, the concrete and pool environment can compromise bonding, and the addition of lifeguard chairs, diving boards, and other metal objects common to all pools can affect safety. The good news is that statistics show no evidence of death by lightening in indoor pools, and we plan to keep it that way!
